Sponsorship/ Donations news

Mary reported that we have had a great number of donations this summer. We have a new sponsor from Pakefield and Brigid would like to sponsor a second child – Mary to send her details for a Standing Order. Anne Felton and Natasha Green would also like to sponsor a second child. We have now received the donation of £500 from Mr & Mrs Mascarenhas and £300 from Hector De Cavilla's estate. We have received a further £500 from Margaret Knox's funeral which together with a previously donated £1000 (MW) for resources and a new donation of £1000 (HT) will be used for the library books, furniture and chairs. The Library is going to be named after Margaret and Andrew Knox and Alan suggested that we produce a plaque for it.

Jam sales have raised over £100 so far and the Garden Party raised £432.15 which included £81 from a Raffle. Colin Childs kindly donated a hamper of Pimms which was raffled and is going to be used at a Pimms Party and all donations will be given to the School.

Mary and Sydna are to meet up to check on sponsorship payments once the books have been returned from the accountant.

Next time the Sponsorship Form is printed we need to include a space for sponsors to write their email address and it was also suggested that the leaflets should be dated.

We currently have £25,597.50 in the Co-op deposit account and £5,889.44 in the Co-op current account with a further £835.76 in the Santander deposit account and £410.86 in the current account making a total of £32,733.06.

£12,500 in sponsorship money was sent on 24th July 2019.
