In spite of some recent attacks by separatists on two military camps in the city and the lack of vaccinations, the school and the sisters seem to be doing well. 'All is calm' reports Sister



Scholastique, headteacher of the nursery school. She sent us some lovely photos and video footage of the nursery children. We have sent some money for them to buy resources which they lacked. The families of the children in the photo cannot afford to buy the uniform but they will contribute a little when they can.

The school inspectors have paid a visit to confirm the number of teachers in the primary school and have informed the authorities in Kinshasa so that they will all be registered and receive a salary. We hope that this time the message will get through, as all primary school teachers are meant to be paid. The

same inspectors will also make a case for the teachers in the secondary school, none of whom is paid by the state. Money will also be needed this year for training costs for those teaching maths and science as the syllabus has changed. The sisters have managed to secure a good deal on the piece of land they need to enlarge the toilet block and we await news of the cost of making these improvements. We hope to update you about the progress of this necessary work in the next newsletter.

University students


The pupils featured in the last newsletter are doing well and Josué,
