## Latest News from Congo

The main picture shows the children from the nursery school waving to us as they return to school. You can see both parts of the school in the background. We have received a report from Sister Émilie with the details of the enrolment so far (enrolment continues until the end of September as not all of the parents can afford to send their children to school at the beginning of the school year). There are eight teachers and 162 children in the nursery section, fourteen teachers and 601 pupils in the primary section and 321 pupils in the secondary section, although the 26 teachers are still only paid from the parents' contributions, meaning less money goes to the school. It was heartening to read, however, that there are now two admin staff and one librarian. Sadly, one of the primary school teachers was killed in a motorbike accident, leaving six children of his own.

sent in block was Financing of the Medical Centre: message from Sr Virginie There is no external funding: it operates



with contributions from patient care and the small pharmacy. Monthly income is not always sufficient to pay staff well and they often have to wait for six weeks before being paid. University interns also do their work experience there. The priority is to buy an x-ray machine because the Centre loses 95% of cases as the doctor is obliged to transfer them to other hospitals in Lubumbashi. Many patients are disappointed by the absence of radiography because they greatly appreciate the quality of care at this centre and prefer to be treated on site. Having an x-ray machine in the Medical Centre will increase the number of patients and bring new life to the little hospital. Cost: \$10,000 (approx. £8,250 which is a huge commitment but money from future fundraising events could go towards this. Ed.)
